What I should already know?

Features in the landscape can be manmade or naturally occurring.

Human features including houses, churches, dams, piers, roads, paths, bridges, motorways, lighthouses, hospitals, schools, shops etc.

Physical features around us can be things like, forests, streams, rivers, ponds, cliffs, lakes, tarns, glaciers, deserts, swamps, trees, rocks, mountains etc.

What I will know by the end of this unit?

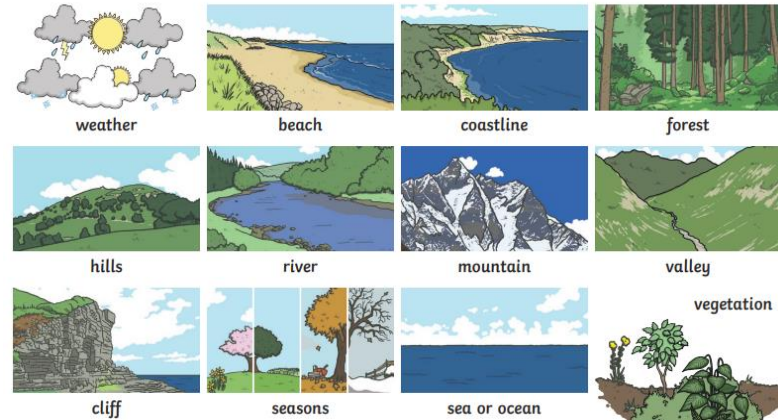
Be able to sort features of the landscape into the categories of 'Human Features' and 'Physical Features'.

Read maps, atlases and globes and explain what is a natural, physical feature, or manmade, human feature.

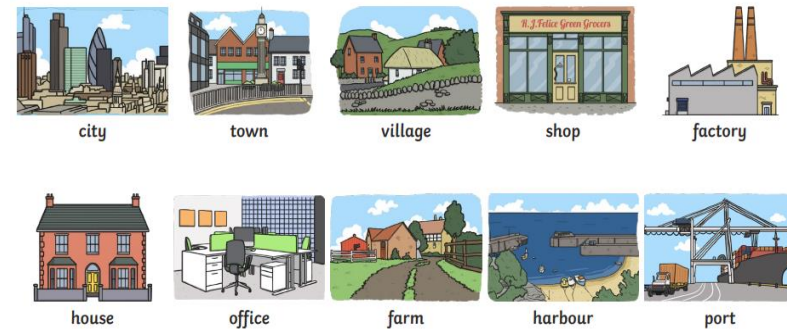
Create maps that show human and physical features of the landscape.
